Year 10 Work Experience -Mathematician

During the first week of the Term 3 holidays I was lucky enough to do work experience at Monash University.

The program was organised by Burkard Polster and Michelle Strumila, and we worked with them on the first two days. We looked at games like '21 Flags' and had to figure out a mathematically optimal play style. Burkard showed us how to animate using powerpoint and we animated proofs for the Pythagorean Theorem.

On the third day, two PhD students came in and we did an optimisation task, regarding the placement of truck depots. This involved a lot of coding and algorithms and really challenged me.

The fourth day was my favourite and the one I found the most interesting. A mathematician called Dr Andy Hammerlindl taught us about tessellation and geometry. I found this kind of puzzle and theoretical mathematics extremely compelling. We finished off the day by learning how to use LaTeX on the website Overleaf, a software used to write maths down easily and clearly. We used it to write a proof regarding one of the things we had done during the work experience.

The lunch breaks were a great opportunity to talk to all the people involved, and I learnt a lot about university and potential career paths in mathematics. I got to explore the Monash campus which was really cool, it's such a massive place! It was a very informative and interesting experience and I'm grateful I got to do it. I think anyone who has a keen interest in maths should consider applying, it's an excellent experience.

Year 11 Physics - Rockets



For one of our assessments in Physics this year, we had to build a rocket in order to prove a hypothesis. For example, one group was trying to prove that the acceleration of the rocket would match their predictions. Mr Gibbs, the Year 11 Physics teacher, had brought some rocket kits for us to assemble.

The process included glueing metal brackets to the engine mounts and fastening them inside the rocket casings. We then had to shape a nose cone out of a small block of wood and attach it to the tube via some string so it would pop off and release the parachute. Mr Gibbs also brought some small rocket engines which we then inserted into their mounts to be fired. We put in an electrical ignitor and then the countdown began. Most of the rockets launched successfully...

...after the third or fourth try, with some going up to 170m high, and some barely reaching 2m. It was a lot of fun and I hope that future students get to have the same experience.


